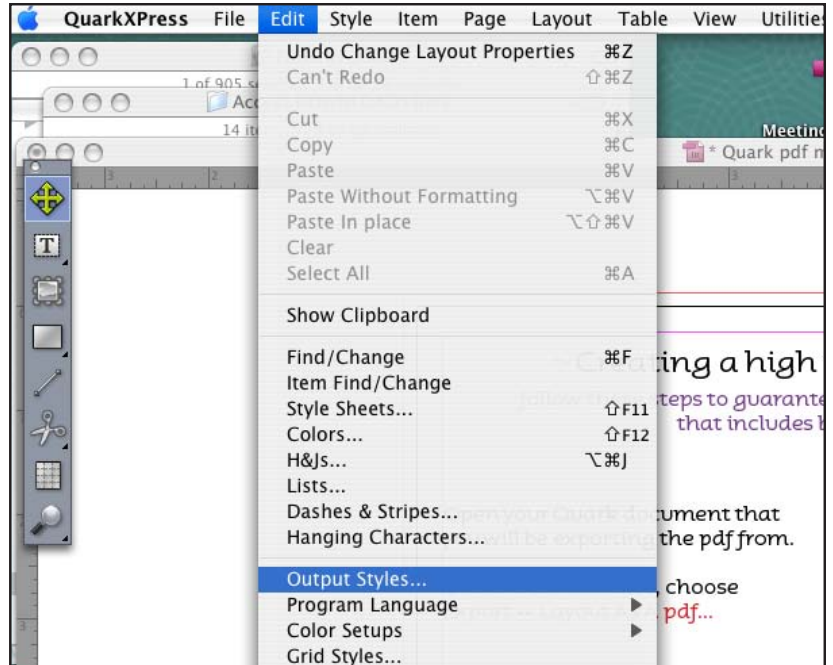


## ~Creating a high res pdf output preset~

follow these steps to guarantee a high resolution, print quality pdf that includes bleed and crop marks

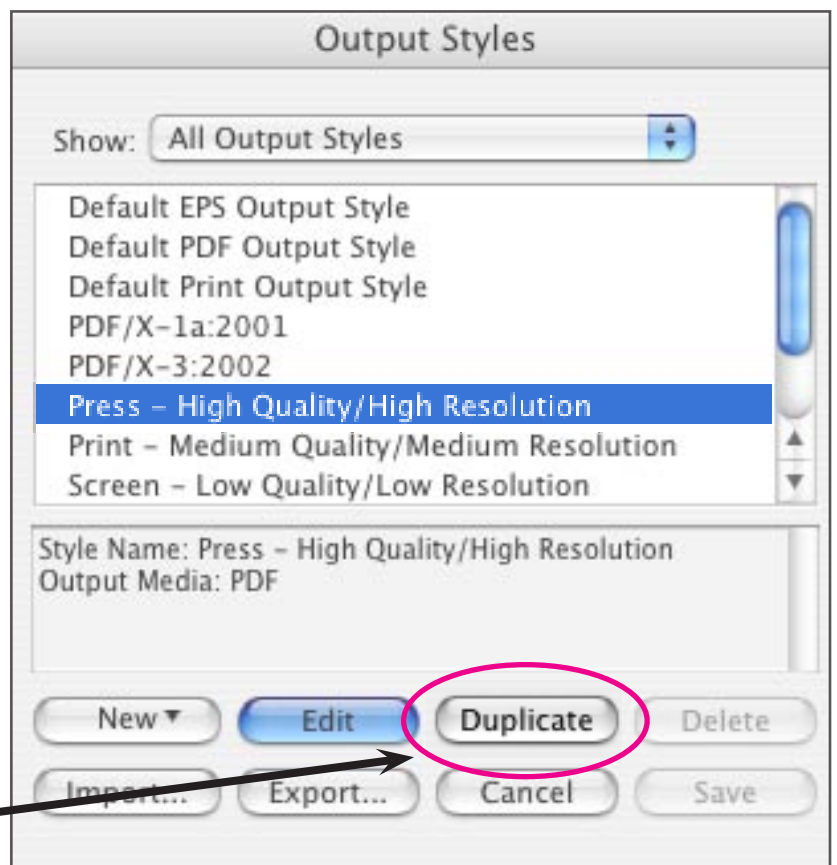
Open your Quark document that you will be exporting the pdf from.

Under the **Edit** menu, choose **Output styles...**



To start with, select **Press - High Quality/High Res...** pdf preset.

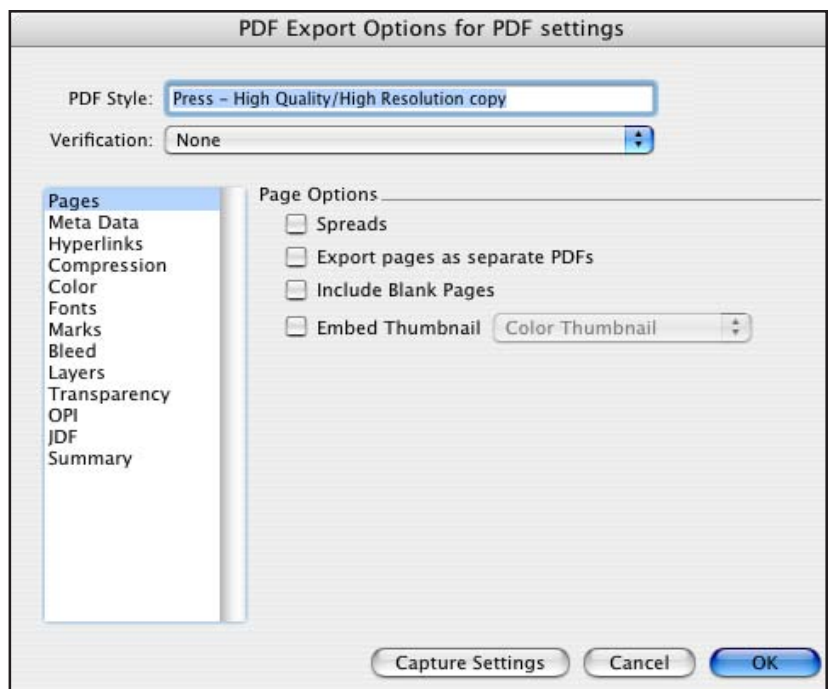
This is a good starting point, but we'll make some modifications.



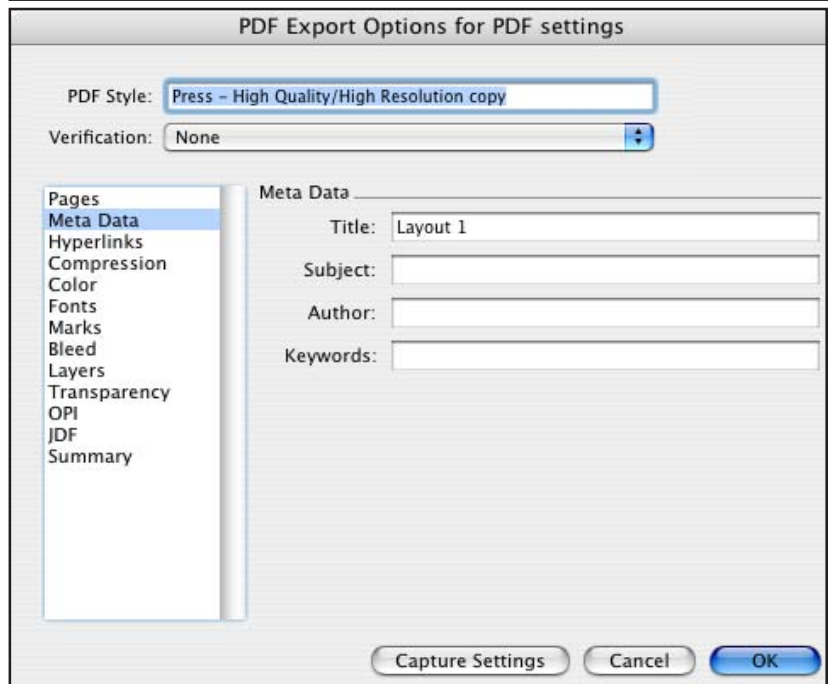
Next, choose **Duplicate**

\*Check to make sure each section looks like the picture next to it.

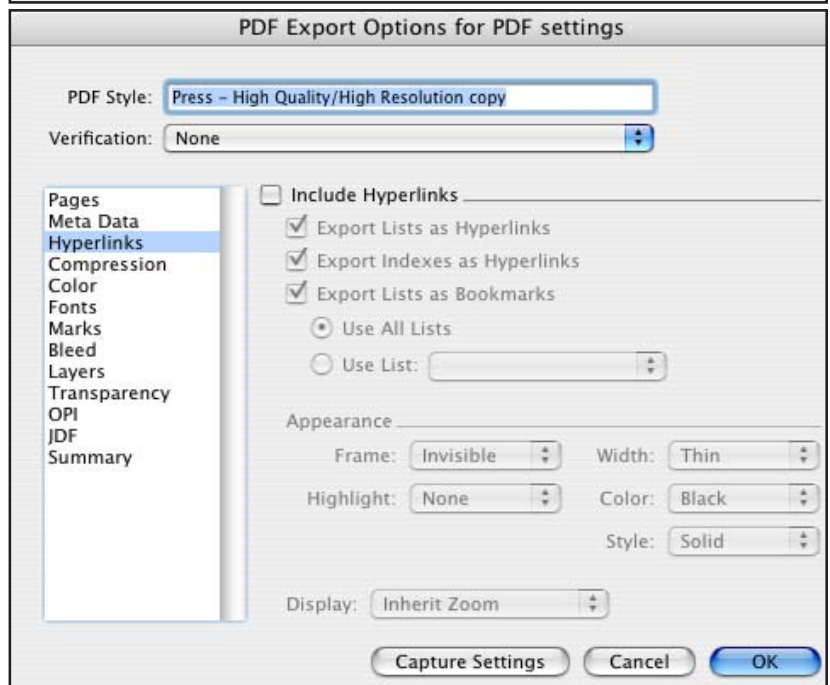

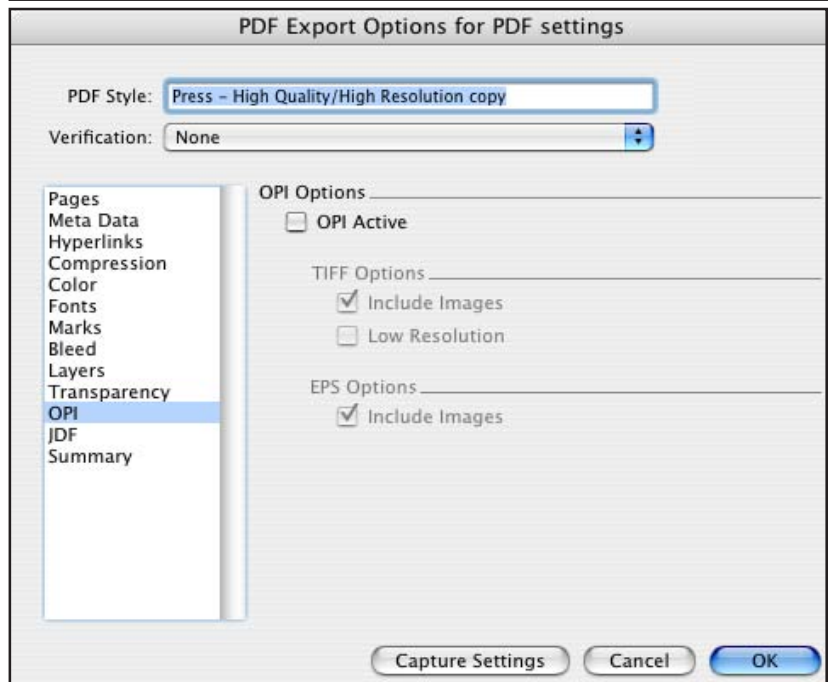


## TRANSPARENCY SECTION

\*If you are experiencing issues with transparent object (such as drop shadows added in quark or other effects), try choosing "Ignore Transparency or Flatten Transparency

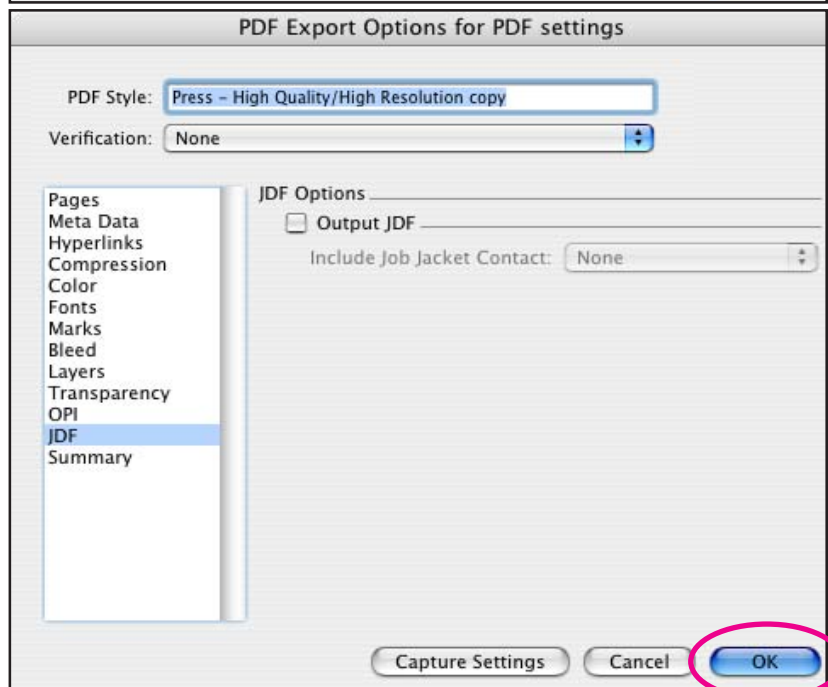

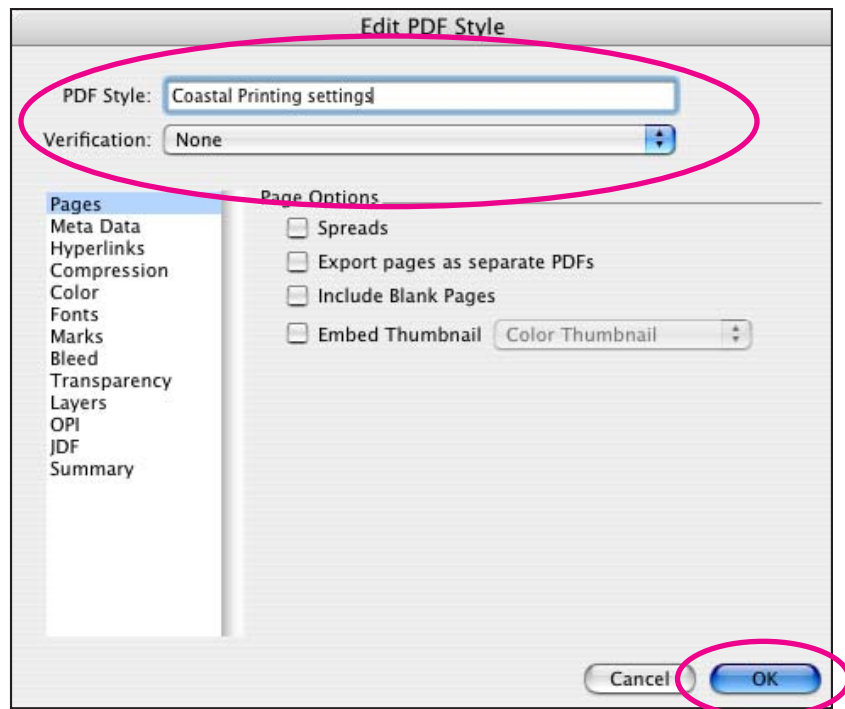

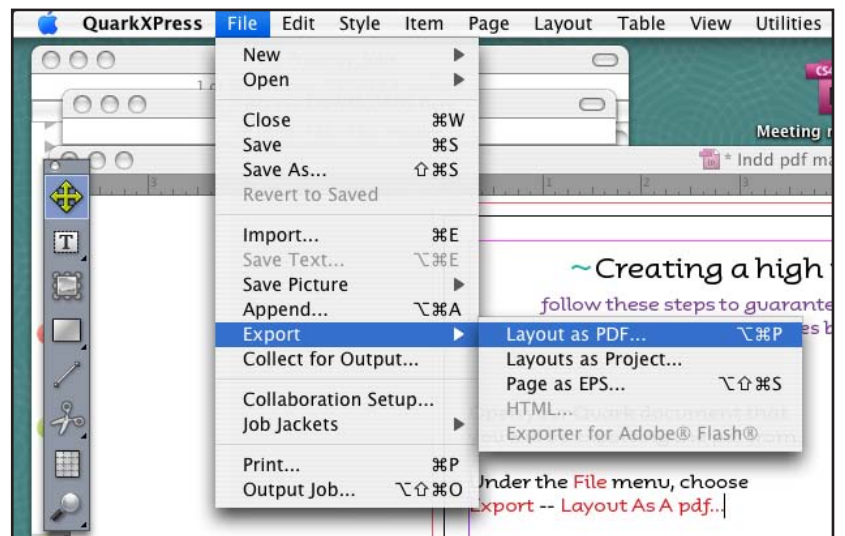
Name the **PDF Style** something you will be able to recognize from the list of pre-sets.

Choose OK

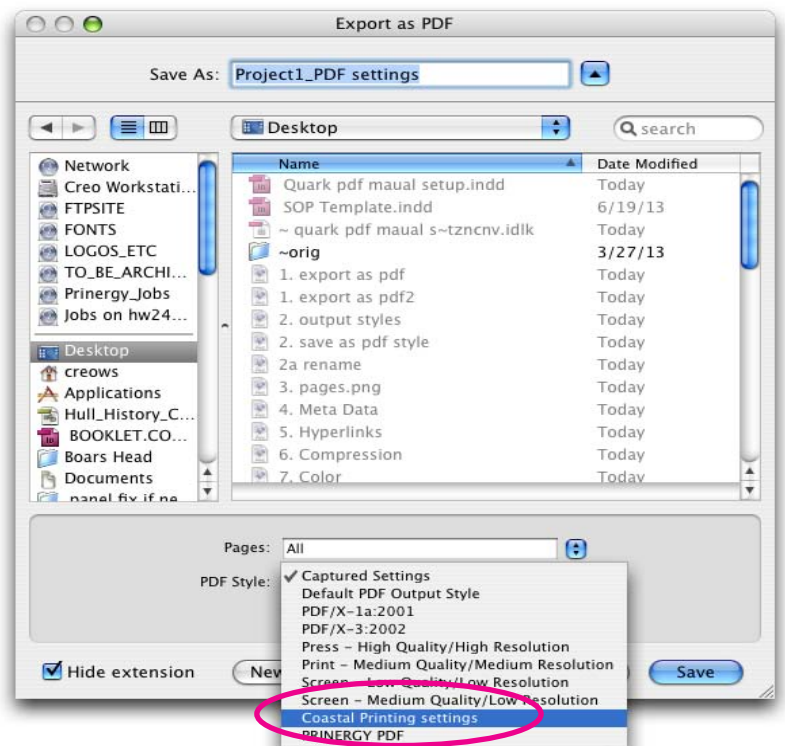


Now let's check to make sure the pdf pre-set is there.
